Certainly, a lot of ink in the Bible is dedicated to Abraham, and some of it records his escapades marked by folly, faithlessness, and failure. The biblical writers made no attempt to airbrush, smooth over, or cover-up the truth to fit some glamorized version of this hero of the faith. As we take a parting look at Abraham's life as a whole, we'll be reminded that he was as much a sinner as he was a saint. And in that realistic portrait, we'll find both warning and inspiration.

2. General Overview of Abraham's Life

Hebrews 11 devotes more verses to the life of Abraham and Sarah than any other Old Testament saint (Hebrews 11:8–19). When we examine both the heights and depths of that nomad's journey of faith, we can learn vital truths about our own walk.

•	The Heights. When he was called, Abrah	am obeyed.	What he was	promised, he	believed.	When he
	was tested, he trusted. As he was blessed	, he shared.				

• The Depths. When he was afraid, he retreated. When he became impatient, he listened to wrong counsel. When he faced a similar test, he repeated the same failure.






